

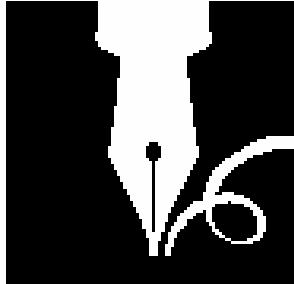

Their pieces will be critiqued if time allows. Remember that manuscripts, your own or on topic, are limited to 6 pages. Format rules are minimum 12-pt. font and double-spaced with one-inch margins on top, bottom and sides.

Put an athlete, artist and a fitness instructor in a museum. Add a broken window and a crooked painting. One of the three panics. Write out the scene.
